#### MERGER OF UNIFOR LOCAL 57 INTO UNIFOR LOCAL 855

#### **DISCONTINUE NATIONAL STAFF SUPERVISION OF LOCAL 103**

Reason: At a December 2020 NEB meeting, a resolution was passed to appoint a national staff member to review and assist with the governance of Unifor Local 103 as serious issues of concerns were raised by the leadership about the governance of the local, deterioration of relationships and the inability to resolve the issue. The local union is now in compliance with Unifor's National Constitution and the leadership is working in collaboration and cooperation, and is achieving the objectives of the local union and its members.
